Nominated as Australian Lecturer of the Year each year since 2010, Dr Nagel has been an invited guest on 'TV New Zealand Breakfast', 'Canada AM', 'Sunrise', 'A Current Affair' and 'The Project'. Dr Nagel is also the Queensland Director of the Australian Council on Children and the Media, a member of the prestigious International Neuropsychological Society, and a feature writer for 'Jigsaw' and the 'Child' series of magazines which collectively offers parenting advice to more than one million Australian readers.

Dr Michael Nagel is one of Australia's leading education commentators. In this seminar he explores the exciting world of brain science and examines how scientific evidence about the brain can be used to guide

practice, whilst observing the evidence behind the importance of play.
